



# Year 3 Summer Term 1 2023

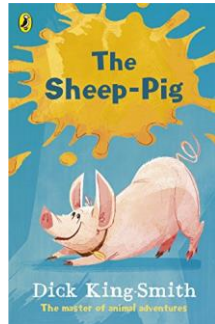

## English:

This term we will be looking at the book 'Sheep pig' by Dick King-Smith. The children will be writing several pieces of work using descriptive language, similes and metaphors. The children will be continuing to develop their vocabulary and identify key features from the text over several guided reading lessons. During these lessons, the children will use their inference, retrieval, predicting and sequencing skills to answer a variety of questions about the text.



There will be more focus on presentation, handwriting and spellings. The children will continue to practice the 3/4 statutory word list. These spellings are sent home weekly and need to be practiced.

**Maths:** Throughout the term, we will be following the 'White Rose' maths scheme.

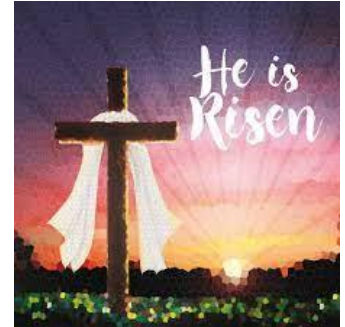
Fractions- in this unit the children will be learning how to add and subtract fractions. They will learn how to partition a whole, use unit and non-unit fractions.

Money- in this unit the children will be learning about pounds and pence. They will also be learning about how to convert pounds and pence, add and subtract money and find change.

**RSE:** Throughout the term, we will be following the scheme 'Ten Ten'.

What is the Church?-In this session, children will learn about the wider Church and its mission to reflect the Holy Trinity through love for others.

## Topic:

Our creative curriculum topics for the summer term will be

History- Ancient Rome. This term the children will be learning the key events that happened in Ancient Rome such as; the Roman Empire, Julius Caesar's invasion attempt on Britain, how the Roman empire has had lasting impact on British society.

D&T- The Great Bread bake off. The children will learn how to make bread, including the steps and ingredients needed.



**Music:** Throughout the term, we will be following the scheme 'Music Express'.

Human Body- in this unit the children will learn songs about the human body. They will use percussion instruments to improvise, create word rhythms and build a final skeleton dance.  
Singing French- linking to the children's French lesson they will be learning how to enhance their understanding through songs.

**Science:**

In Science this term, the children will be learning about rocks and soil. The children will compare and group together different kinds of rocks on the basis of their appearance and simple physical properties; describe in simple terms how fossils are formed and recognise that soils are made from rocks and organic matter.

**Computing:**

Simulation- in this unit the children will be exploring what a simulation is. Children can begin to evaluate simulations by comparing them with real situations and consider their usefulness.

**Homework:**

Timestable- the children need to be practicing their times table at home and they will be tested on them every week. The times tables to focus on include 2s, 5s, 10s, 3s, 4s and 8s.
