# Year 4 Summer Term 2 2023

Intentional and Prophetic

## English:

This term we will be reading Cinderboy as a class and basing reading and writing activities around what we have read. Pupils read daily and can quiz using accelerated reading.

Handwriting will continue to be a focus in all lessons as well as learning the spelling and spelling patterns from the statutory Year 3/4 word list. We ask that you help your child with learning their spellings each week, which will be set via Purplemash.



## RE:

#### Pentecost:

In this unit the children will study the story of Pentecost and identify the effects that it had upon the disciples. They will learn about the missionary activity of the Apostles and some prayers of the Holy Spirit.

#### Special Roles and Responsibilities:

In this unit the children will learn about the different tasks and responsibilities given to people in the Church. This will help them to develop their understanding of the Church as the Body of Christ made up of many different people.

#### RHE:

What am I feeling? Children will learn to examine their feelings, and try to understand them and what causes them. They will be given some techniques to scrutinise their feelings and determine whether they are a good guide for taking action.

What am I looking at? Through activities and creative role play, this session encourages children to see through the fake reality that is presented to them on television, in magazines and on adverts: they will compare these representations and stereotypes to their own life experiences.

I am thankful: Pupils will learn that particular feelings and pressures may make us want to act inappropriately, and so they will learn how to build resilience in various ways, including choosing to be thankful.

**Maths:** Throughout the term, we will be following the 'White Rose' maths scheme This will include:

Identifying, comparing and ordering angles. Recognising and using triangles, quadrilaterals and polygons.

Interpret charts
Interpret and draw line graphs

Use and plot coordinates

Draw and translate 2D shapes on a grid

# Geography:

In this Unit, identify the position and significance of latitude, longitude, Equator, Northern Hemisphere, Southern Hemisphere, the Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn, Arctic and Antarctic Circle, the Prime/Greenwich Meridian and time zones (including day and night)

#### Art:
